Review of Mount of Transfiguration, Mary, and John at Patmos-discoveries:

2 Corinthians 3:15-18

In beholding Christ's glory, we are transformed into the same image from glory to glory by the Spirit of God.

2 Corinthians 4:5-7

The glory of God in the face of Jesus

Glory brings transformation into the image of the glory; but often first brings disruption to the image we are holding of ourselves.

Testimony in preparing for the class

Isaiah 6 *

Isaiah saw the Lord and His glory and was undone. He became aware of His uncleanness. He was purged, heard a new calling and was able to say, "Here am I, send me." Then he was sent out with a new message----Disruption first, transformation then follows.

John changed from the woe is everyone—to the woe is me—to here I am, send me - through beholding His glory!

The message he was given was quoted by Jesus in all the gospels.

John 12:37-41

Homework:

- 1. Find where the message, that Isaiah (*Isaiah 6:9-10*) was given, was quoted by Jesus in the Gospels and in Acts and Romans.
 - * Hint: To find the verses in the Gospels, Acts and Romans, look up Isaiah 6,9 and 10, in a bible with a center reference. They should be listed there.
- 2. Meditate in the glory encounter that Jesus had with Saul of Tarsus on the road to Damascus and the impact it had on Paul throughout His life. *Acts 9, 22, 26*
