

The Glorified Son of Man

Session 3 – Revelation - Class 1 Notes

The Lord spoke before class that He would bring each of us, His body, into a new glory encounter with the glorified Son of Man, in order for us to be undone and fall down to rise in His new authority.

Ezekiel sees the glory of God and falls down to be lifted up by the Spirit, entering in him to hear the Lord commission Ezekiel for his next assignment.

Ezekiel 1:26-28; 2:1, 2

Isaiah is going around calling woes on everyone until he sees the Lord high and lifted up. He is then undone. Seeing his own uncleanness, he cries out, “Woe is me.” The coal from the altar cleanses his lips, and his ears hear the invitation into a new calling.

Isaiah 6

John the Beloved was on the Island of Patmos for the word of God and testimony of Jesus, but he was in the Spirit on the Lord’s day. All revelation is met with tribulation to prove the truth in us. The devil plans to disengage us through tribulation from the word spoken, and the Father intends for the word to go deeper and be planted in us to bear much fruit—thirty, sixty, and a hundredfold.

Revelation 1

There must be a new revelation of Jesus for us to fall at His feet dead, for Him to place His right hand on us and call us out of fear into a new revelation of Himself and message for His church.

Being undone is the gift of God in seeing God—taking us from where we are to who He is.

Homework: Read and Meditate Revelation, Chapter One, taking time to see, hear, and understand what the Spirit is saying. Turn to the voice that speaks, and see. After we see, we fall to rise into the new.
