The Glory of God in the Face of Jesus

Session 3 – Revelation - Class 9 Notes

2 Peter 1:16-21

The power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ - Peter recounted the glory and honor that Jesus received from the Father on the Mount of Transfiguration. This experience, with Jesus Christ in glory, continued to mark Peter even to his later years.

Matthew 17:1-8

Jesus was transfigured before Peter, James, and John.

Revelation 1:10-18

John was in the Spirit on the Lord's day. He heard a loud voice, as of a trumpet. Turning to see the voice, he saw the glorified Christ and gives vision to us with descriptive language to mediate and see the glorified Son of Man. Still, after all these years, John fell down in the fear of God.

2 Corinthians 3.16-18

We turn to Jesus, and the veil is taken away. We behold in the mirror of His word the glory of the Lord being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord.

2 Corinthians 4:6

God commands the light of the glory of God to shine in our hearts in the face of Jesus Christ.

Psalm 45:1-7

My heart overflows with a good theme; I recite my composition concerning the king; my tongue is the pen of a ready writer—the King suits for battle and rides prosperously because of truth, humility, and righteousness. The people fall under Him. The imagery is of the glorified Christ piercing the hearts of His enemies, to then become the hearts of His friends, as they become saved in the knowledge of Him. *Acts* 2:37

Revelation 19:11-16

A final image of the Lord's return with us His saints all riding on white horses. Note the similarity of visions between *Psalm 45* and *Revelation 19*. Always the same Jesus, we are maturing in our ability to see and receive.

The result is: We are changed.
